About the Award

The "Step Up" award was established by a Christian Island Cottager. Each year, funds are gathered from fellow cottagers and friends to assist Beausoleil First Nation Youth in their pursuit of post-secondary education, whether it be with an accredited University or College, a training or apprenticeship, an internship, a program of part-time studies or any of a number of other educational enterprises. The intent of the award, which adheres to an expansive definition of "post-secondary education", is intended to help a broad range of graduating secondary school students take the next steps towards their future through further education.

Eligibility

Beausoleil First Nation Youth under the age of 22 who are graduating from secondary school in the current academic year, or those who have graduating and been out of school for no more than two years may apply.

Purpose of the Award

The "Step Up" award is intended to support applicants who clearly demonstrate the need for financial assistance in achieving their educational goals. Applications will be assessed in accordance with established criteria. "Step Up" awards do not have to be repaid.

Amount of the Award

Submitting an application does not guarantee than an application will receive funding. There is no set amount for the award – every applicant is assessed individually. The level of financial assistance varies according to the assessed financial need of applicants, the number of applicants, and the availability of funds for allocation.

Allocation of Awards

Applications are reviewed by an Allocations Committee composed of three individuals: two Beausoleil First Nation members assigned to the committee by the Beausoleil First Nation Education Department and one Christina Island Cottager, assigned to the award by the "Step Up" Award founder. After reviewing applications the Allocation Committee will choose the recipient(s) and determine the amount(s) to be awarded. The decisions made by the Allocations Committee are final.

Assessment Criteria:

When assessing applications, the Committee uses the following criteria.

- Demonstrated financial need
- Evidence of suitability and commitment to field of study.
- Demonstrated academic merit and performance.

Successful Award Recipients

- Awards allocated must be used for the program of study specified on the application form.
- All awards are a matter of public record and may be published by the Beausoleil First Nation Education Department and the "Step Up" Award founders.

Notification

All applicants – successful or otherwise – will receive written notification of the Committee's decision regarding their individual application.

Application Process

Conditions:

- 1) Awards are provided for the academic year that begins in the fall term (September) of the4 year of the application, or for programs, courses and other initiatives beginning no more than ten months from July 31 of the year of application.
- 2) Applicants will be contacted by the Beausoleil First Nation Education Department should there be questions about their application package.
- 3) Applicants must complete all sections of the application form.
- 4) Applicants must provide the following documents with their application forms:
- •Official transcript indicating the student's most recent record of studies and grades
- Letter addressed to the "Allocations Committee" (minimum 500 words, maximum 1,500 words stating:
- a.) academic achievements, artistic accomplishments, community service, volunteerism, entrepreneurship and/or leadership
- b.) the field of study to be pursued
- c.) the program, course(s) or activities for which funds are being requested
- d.) why the applicant is passionate about this field of study
- e.) any special circumstances that the applicant thinks the Allocation Committee should give consideration in reviewing your application
- Verification of tuition & fees (from course calendar, brochure, or webpage).
- •Confirmation of acceptance in an educational program, however, if this information is not available at the time the application is due, applicants must provide this documentation to the Beausoleil First Nation Education Department as soon as it becomes available.

Application Deadline

Health Student Scholarship Fund

Lawrence (Larry) E. Sandy was the founding father of the Beausoleil Family Health Centre. His life in the healthcare field began when he became one of the original First Responders of Beausoleil First Nation, and grew from there. He implemented a 911 service at his home, before the island had the capabilities. Community members would call his home number and he would go out and assess the situation. He eventually trained to become the first Community Health Representative, graduating in Sudbury in 1980, and again from Mohawk College in 1990. During this time, Larry secured funding for the program through AHWS (now IHWS), which eventually became funded by Health Canada. During his career as a CHR, he also secured funding to build the first Community Health Centre, which has been expanded on at its current location. When the building opened, there was him (CHR) and a NNADAP worker until he found funding to bring in a Community Health Nurse as well. Eventually, finding funding for the role of Health Director, Larry became the first Health Director of Beausoleil First Nation and held that role until the time of his death. He treated his staff like family, always supporting and encouraging them to do what needed to be done. Larry was awarded the Anishnabek Nation Lifetime Achievement Award posthumously in 2008. He worked hard day and night and helped everyone he could, in any capacity he could. He played baseball and worked with the youth, coaching on Christian Island and in Midland, and was a part of the EAGLE Project (Ecological Assessment of the Great Lake Ecosystem). He was also involved in the yearly "Island in the Sun" music festival.

Who is eligible?

This award is intended for a BFN student entering from high school into a college or University of their choice in the Health Care Field.

What type of financial assistance is available?

This is a scholarship of up to \$2000.00 to a BFN Student entering any program within the Healthcare Field.

How do I submit the application?

Applications (including documentation and essay) should be submitted in hard copy form to the Education Office in the Beausoleil First Nation Administration Building. Email is acceptable.

What do I include in my application?

- 1) Provide a copy of the most current official transcript or report card.
- 2) Provide proof of acceptance into college or university of your choice.
- 3) Provide a letter of recommendation from a teacher/colleague supporting your application Health Student Scholarship Fund
- 4) Write an essay (1000 words) on how you have benefitted from your community involvement and how it has prepared you to succeed in your post-secondary education.

After graduating from Midland Secondary School in Midland, Vic worked hard in starting and opening a small family convenience store. His hard work, dedication and bright spirit allowed him to become a respected and successful entrepreneur. Vic's passion lies within his community and his family. Vic worked effortlessly to mentor and hire Chimnissing youth through summer and full-time positions within his store, advocating for men's mental health and philanthropy through various donations, and volunteering within the community. Victor Blake Monague was a volunteer firefighter in the Beausoleil Fire Department, where he continued his educational journey by taking part in certified training and earning various certificates and licenses. Victor had a love for music, being on the water boating or fishing and sports, especially baseball. Alongside all of these accomplishments, most importantly, he was a loving father, husband, son, brother, uncle, cousin, and a valued community member who defined the term "entrepreneurial spirit."

What is an entrepreneurial spirit?

An entrepreneurial spirit is a self-motivated attitude and mentality that drives a person to fulfill their potential and purpose. This invisible force creates action-oriented, productive, decisive, inspirational, innovative, and self-sacrificing leaders.

Victoria Francis Tobey Mueller Bravery Award

About the Award:

Victoria Francis Tobey Mueller's life was an inspiration to her family and friends. She exemplified the innate Bravery of the Anishinabe people through her actions and has motivated many in her immediate family to achieve success in life and give back to their people.

Born in Honey Harbour, Ontario on March 22, 1909 to Peter [Anawmedabe] & Delina Tobey she inherited her Mother's gift for healing, and her Father's belief in continuing education. During the summers in Honey Harbour, Medical Doctors would vacation at local cottages and when needed provided their expertise to the local people even though most all health was maintained and sickness handled by traditional Indian herbal remedies.

Through these interactions with the visiting Medical Doctors, Victoria was encouraged to become formally educated as a nurse. In order to do so, she would need to move to Buffalo, New York and attend a Nursing School. Victoria moved away without knowing anyone and became a Nurse, but never forgot her roots. She maintained a close relationship with family and passed on her passion for helping others to her children.

The Victoria Francis Tobey Mueller Bravery Award is for Beausoleil First Nation Members in pursuit of post-secondary type education, whether it be with an accredited University or College, training or apprenticeship program, internship, a program of part-time studies or any of a number of other educational endeavors. The intent of the award, which adheres to an expansive definition of "postsecondary education", is intended to help a broad range of graduating secondary school students, as well as, other steps towards their future through fulfilling their goals.

Eligibility:

Must be a Beausoleil First Nation member entering an accredited post secondary institution. Include a 750 word essay explaining the brave steps you have taken towards your educational goals that resemble those of Victoria Tobey-Mueller. Emails are accepted.

Purpose of the Award:

The Victoria Francis Tobey Mueller Bravery Award is intended to support applicants who demonstrate the desire of achieving their educational goals. Applications will be assessed in accordance with established criteria.
