Current Approved Level of Service / Skill Set:

Only Paramedics that hold current qualifications as set out by the Ambulance Act and related Provincial Legislation will be permitted to staff each ambulance as a Primary Care Paramedic (PCP), with the following approved skill set:

Autonomous Peripheral Intravenous and Fluid Therapy Continuous Positive Airway Pressure (CPAP) 12-Lead Electrotherapy

Semi-Automatic External Defibrillation

Oxvgen Therapy

Administration of the following Symptom Relief Medications:

- Dextrose 50%
- Glucagon
- Oral Glucose
- Epinephrine

- Nitroglycerin
- Acetylsalicylic Acid (ASA)
- Salbutamol

All Paramedics employed by BFN EMS are held to the standards of the MOHLTC BLS PCS and ALS PCS.

Service Reaction and Response to Scene Time:

Service reaction time (T2 – T3) of < 1 minutes on code 4 calls for on-site staff.

The Beausoleil First Nation EMS service response time commitment is outlined in the annual Response Time Performance Plan (RTPP) as approved by Beausoleil First Nation and submitted to the MOHLTC by October 31st annually. The most current RTPP is posted the BFN EMS base and can be found on the BFN EMS Website.
