To our visitors/cottagers, as you may or may not be aware, West Beach is our only designated area for camping by the general public. This is a reminder to all our visitors/cottagers that we do follow a beach by-law and we will be enforcing the said By-Law #20.

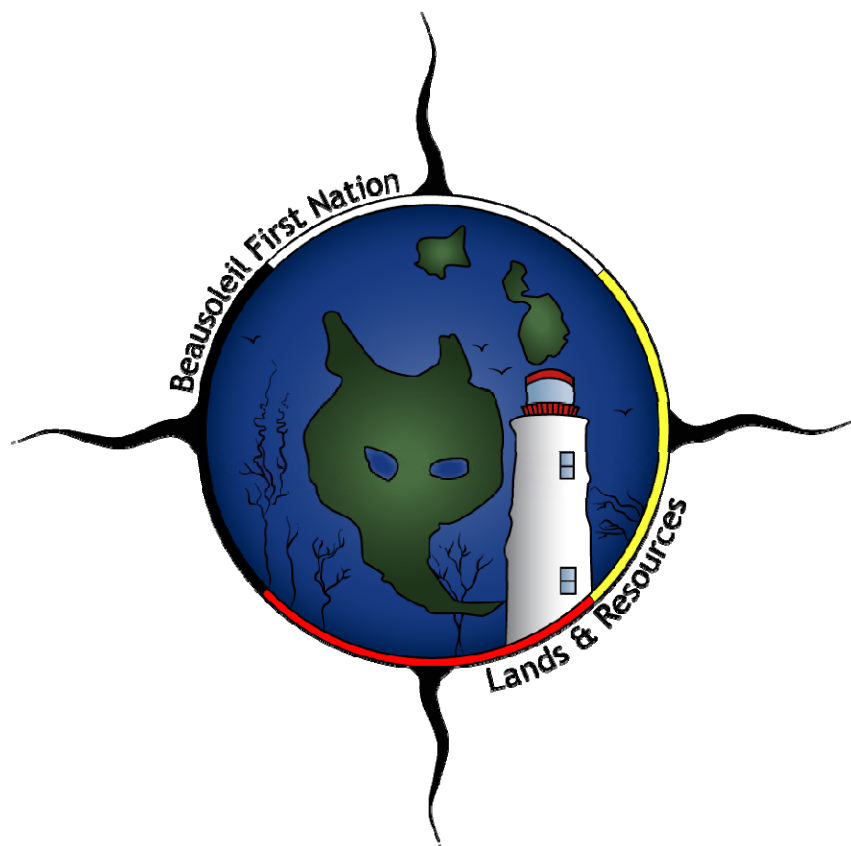
Beausoleil First Nation members can camp at any beach, but the following must be stated. It is continually noted that it is usually our own members who leave the beaches in a terrible condition. Garbage, broken glass, camping equipment, etc. is being left on the beaches. Drinking and rude, rowdy behaviour is also a concern.

Just a friendly reminder to our Beausoleil First Nation members and cottagers/members, that if you wish to camp at our beaches:

Leave the beach as you found it and take all of your personal property with you when leave along with any garbage/debris. Be respectful to yourselves and to others. And members, we need to set an example to our visitors that the type of behaviour we would like to see, should be the type of behaviour that we exhibit as well.

It is very important that we all obey this By-law. A person who commits an offence under this by-law is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$1,000.00 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days, or to both.
