

**DRIVE CLEAN APPLICATION FORM:
Christian Island Temporary Exemption**

This application for temporary Drive Clean exemption is valid for motor vehicles currently registered on Christian Island with a L9M 0A9 postal code. The motor vehicle can be a car, van, SUV or light pickup truck only. Heavy trucks and buses are not eligible for exemption.

When your exemption is approved, you will be advised by telephone that you have seven days from notification to complete your vehicle registration renewal or resale transfer.

With this new process, each vehicle owner registered to the postal code L9M 0A9 who has received a notice to have their vehicle Drive Clean tested will need to complete the attached form and submit it, along with a copy of their vehicle registration, to the Drive Clean contact centre for processing. The Drive Clean contact centre will then contact the motorist to advise them when they can go to ServiceOntario to complete their vehicle transaction. Unlike with the Out-of-Province exemption process, this exemption will remain in effect until a longer term solution is in place.

I previously mentioned that the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change is proposing regulatory changes to allow for the exemption of vehicles registered to residents of islands with seasonal ferry service (and no road, bridge, or causeway access) from the testing requirements of the Drive Clean program. It is anticipated that these proposed changes will be posted to the Environmental Bill of Rights (EBR) Registry (<http://www.ontario.ca/environmentalregistry>) for a public comment period in late summer/early fall. I will ensure that your community receives notification of the EBR Registry instrument notice when it is posted. I would encourage you and your community to review the changes and provide us with any comments.
