- Must be a Beausoleil First Nation member on the date of the application
- Eligible harvesting activities include but are not limited to:
 - Hunting, trapping, fishing, gardening for sustenance, maple syrup production (any size operation), apiaries, traditional food and medicine processing
- Provide quotes for requested items on your application
- Absolutely **NO cash advances** will be provided, no exceptions.
- Cannot be used for the purchase of firearms, bows or ammunitions
- Only approved items outlined in the application will be purchased or reimbursed.
- Maximum funding opportunity of \$500.00, per household, per fiscal year. If you have received the Spring/Summer grant you are ineligible for the Fall/Winter Harvesting Support Grant.
